My name is Alyssa Huffman, and I was a Kemmerer Village resident for two years. Growing up, my parents were not able to take care of me, and I ended up in an emergency shelter. After 23 days in the emergency shelter, I was placed at Kemmerer Village. My new home was in North Cottage. The staff and the girls were nice, but I didn't like it at first. Finally, I settled in, and had a schedule and routine that my previous life had been lacking. Looking back now, the schedule and structure are just what I needed most in my life. At Kemmerer I always had food, I was safe, and I made it to school every day. I also got to play sports. Playing sports with my team and my coaches was definitely one of my favorite things about being there. While at Kemmerer we were also given privileges for good behavior. Some privileges included dining off campus, going to the movies, swimming at the Y, and even my first and only trip I've ever taken to 6 Flags! After I worked my program at Kemmerer, I was not able to return to my family, so I was placed with a foster family through Kemmerer Village. I was 16 and lived with my foster family until I was 18.

As an adult now, I am very grateful for my experience at Kemmerer Village and don't know where I would be if Kemmerer hadn't been available. I grew to love many of the staff there over the years as they cared for me, built bonds with me, and made sure my needs were met when I had nobody else. I made lifelong friendships with some of the other residents who were there with me.

This January, I came back to Kemmerer to visit one of my former staff, and to show my kids and my fiancé where I lived. Being able to walk the campus and see the place that changed my life forever was an absolutely amazing experience. My kids and fiancé got to see a part of my life they never knew existed, but a part of my life that helped build me into who I am today.

Kemmerer helped me be successful and prepared me to go out in life and be a responsible, and respectful adult. I'm thankful for the time I spent at Kemmerer and I'm happy to share my success story as I hope Kemmerer is around for a long time to keep helping kids like me.
