In 2022, as in the past 108 years, Kemmerer Village adapted successfully to changing demands. We made the difficult decision to reduce our residential capacity for the 2021 fiscal year based on staffing concerns, but plan to increase our on campus residential capacity in early 2023. Our hiring for both the Residential and Community Services departments has been strong throughout 2022. Our Community Services teams now support more than 180 children in that program. We have also continued to further provide wonderful camping experiences for children at our Camp Crew in Southern Illinois.

Looking forward, we are exploring options for program expansion. We will continue to focus on providing excellent services, supporting our staff, volunteers, interns and foster parents to contribute to our mission in every way. I am confident that Kemmerer Village will continue to serve children and their families in many diverse ways for years to come.

#### **Need For Services**

Illinois has reduced the number of children in substitute care from a peak of 51,596 in mid-FY 1997 to 15,000 currently. As the number of children in protective care declines, the needs of the population of children in care have changed as well. Approximately 36.4% of the children in care today are age 13 years and over and also have a need for intensive physical and/or mental health services. These services are provided by the private sector.


Using information posted on the DCFS website for the year 2022, in Illinois, over 94,000 investigations are opened statewide and approx. 25,000 plus of those occur in the central region which Kemmerer Village primarily serves (Although we do operate statewide)

In the counties surrounding Kemmerer Village, there are currently over 1100 children in substitute care

Statewide, there are around 8400 licensed foster homes, Kemmerer Village serves 120 homes and over 200 children annually

Statewide, there are 60 Child Care institutions remaining serving over 1000 clients. Kemmerer Village currently serves around 40 of these clients annually and receives over 200 referrals each year from DCFS Private Families, Schools, Courts, and DHS





2022 Placements/Referrals Residential Referrals by Source

Kemmerer Village programs reached over 1400 clients in 2022. While the IIAA provided our broadest out reach, all programs serve the entire state of Illinois. Residentially, we received referrals from 63 of Illinois 102 counties and 6 different states.


Foster Care traditionally serves our surrounding counties, but also receives emergency referrals from all over Illinois.

We continue to look to expand current and new programming to serve the ever growing needs and numbers of children and families in Illinois

Foster Care had 27 cases referred in 2022. Those cases involved 49 total new clients

In total for 2022, 35 of the clients served achieved Permanency 20 total clients were finalized through Adoption!!!

With a staff of over 130 dedicated professionals accross a variety of fields, Kemmerer Village has contact with and directly impacts over 1400 clients annually through programs like the Illinois Interagency Athletic Association, Camp Carew, Residential Programming and Foster care Programs




The Healthcare department is responsible for the administration of campus medications as well as coordinating all healthcare visits for the campus population and Psychiatric care through Dr.

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Kemmerer Village has worked to support our clients by maintaining a healthy workforce. In 2022 we received over 230 applications for positions in our agency ranging from cooks to case aides and from Camp Counselors to Therapists. 49 staff were hired and this enabled us to maintain all ratios as required by licensing across our various programs

Utilizing a modern online, cross platform approach has allowed Kemmerer Village to increase the number of applicants as well as streamline the onboarding process. This allowed us to expand staffing levels to the benefit of all programs

Kemmerer Village participates in the National School lunch Program (NSLP)





This revenue totals approximately 4.9 million or 53% of our budget


The difference is made up through donations, fundraisers, and support from our Foundation










The Financial Development office is managing the Kemmerer Village website and social media platforms. Last year kemmerervillage.org had 32,000 views.

The Therapeutic Recreation Department were able to provide many positive experiences for our youth in 2022 ranging from: sports, gardening, music, attending special events, arts/crafts, and more.

The Illinois Inter Agency Athletic Association (IIAA) makes it possible for our youth at Kemmerer Village and from programs around the state to participate in sports programming as well as other social events. At every game and tournament our youth participate in, they are scored on their sportsmanship. We offer a wide variety of athletics and activities for our kids that the IIAA sponsors such as: track, softball, soccer, basketball, volleyball, bowling, arts and crafts competitions, and more. The IIAA is led by Mr. David Dance, who is the IIAA Director and Therapeutic Recreation Director at KV, and he blesses our youth and other agency's youth around the state of Illinois with this excellent

program.







Camp Carew provides a setting in which the Christian faith can be experienced in fellowship with others. We seek to help people deepen their awareness of God, each other, and the natural world by providing a camp program and a setting in which personal growth can take place. A week of camp was canceled due to incidence of COVID for camp staff. If this week had occurred, the total would have exceeded 135. One camp week had 44 children in attendance which is the most for a single camp week in several years
